Conflict Minerals Declaration

Volburg SIA hereby declares that the minerals used in the products supplied to our customers are **Conflict-Free**.

This policy establishes the framework through which **Volburg SIA** complies with **Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act** regarding Conflict Minerals.

There has been increased global awareness of violence and human rights violations associated with the extraction and trade of certain minerals originating from the **Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC)** and adjoining countries, commonly referred to as the “**Conflict Region**.” These minerals are sometimes mined under conditions that finance armed groups and contribute to conflict in the region.

Industry organizations such as the **Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC)** and the **Global e-Sustainability Initiative (GeSI)** have requested companies to exercise reasonable due diligence within their supply chains to ensure that specified minerals are not sourced from mines in the Conflict Region that are controlled by non-governmental military groups or unlawful armed factions.

Volburg SIA conducts due diligence within its supply chain to support responsible sourcing of minerals and to ensure that the metals **gold (Au), tantalum (Ta), and tin (Sn)** used in our products are **not derived from or sourced from mines located in conflict areas of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or adjoining countries**, and are **not illegally taxed or traded by armed groups**.

Based on information received from our suppliers and our supply chain due diligence activities, **Volburg SIA confirms that the metals used in products supplied to our customers are considered “DRC Conflict-Free.”**

Volburg SIA remains committed to responsible sourcing practices and will continue to monitor and review its supply chain to ensure compliance with applicable regulations and industry standards.
